How to Get Red Wine out of Carpet

1. Don't Scrub!

Scrubbing may work fine on wood floors or tiles, but with carpet. You're only making the situation worse. You'll only spread the stain to its farthest possible extent. **Instead**, grab some paper towels and gently pat the affected area to try to absorb any moisture.

2. Avoid Strong Cleaning Products

This is not the kind of surface where you can just pour some bleach on the problem and it will go away. You might be able to remove the stain, but most chemicals are going to stain the carpet or damage its texture.

3. Get a fan

After you have used a sponge or paper-towel, the best thing you can do is place a fan near the targeted area and let it work to further dry things out. Do not use a hairdryer!

4. Call the Professionals

The longer you wait, the more difficult a job it will be. If you can get someone in quickly, they can not only take care of the spilled area but, since they are already there, also give the rest of the carpet the deep cleaning it deserves.
